




How Weather Normalization Adjustment Offers More Predictability for Customer Bills

To make customers' bills more predictable, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) approved Peoples' use of a Weather Normalization Adjustment (WNA). WNA is a common billing method used by many utilities to offer predictability by making an adjustment for the difference between actual temperatures and normal temperatures in your bill. WNA applies to bills rendered from October 1 - May 31.


What this means for you:



If temperatures are more than 3 percent **colder** than normal in a given billing cycle, **customers** may see a credit on their bill.



In billing cycles where the weather is within 3 percent of normal, customers likely will not have a Weather Normalization Adjustment.



If temperatures are more than three percent warmer than normal in a given billing cycle, customers may see an adjustment on their bill.

Important things to know:

- The WNA ONLY applies to distribution charges so in warmer-than-normal months, when you have a WNA charge, you will likely pay less for the gas itself, because less will be used during that cycle.
- "Normal" weather is a calculation based on historical temperature data and expected future temperatures and is approved by the PUC.
